The Deakin Fellowship for Internationalisation (DFI) program presents a unique opportunity for innovative and ambitious staff at Deakin to develop themselves into the next generation of leaders in international education.

About DFI

DFI is a training program developed by the International Relations Office (IRO) of Deakin International. It provides a unique opportunity for aspiring Deakin staff to develop themselves into the next generation of leaders in international education.

The program will be delivered to a small group comprising both academic and professional staff over five bi-monthly sessions. It will aim to broaden and strengthen your knowledge and understanding of internationalisation within the Higher Education (HE) sector in Australia and beyond. Input from eminent academic leaders and policy makers, who have first-hand experience in international education and leadership, will provide participants with insight into the application of international engagement in a range of settings.

DFI represents a rare opportunity for selected Deakin participants to expand internal and external networks; set stretching and inspiring international goals; enhance their personal profile; and interact with the leadership team at Deakin and external experts in the field of international education.

Who is DFI for?

DFI is for those in a full-time continuing employment with Deakin, typically in a role graded HEW 5 and above or in academic appointment (lecturer and above), and who aspire to play a major role in complex international projects with broad and strategic impact.

Structure and dates

Commencing with a networking lunch with University executives and other senior officers, the program is structured to give you a holistic view of the landscape of international education and the implications for Deakin. It centres on a series of top-level master's classes, each presented by internal experts and external stakeholders, which capture the diversity of internationalisation within global HE. Each of the sessions will include ample time for discussion and reflection. The program covers:

- The international education landscape
- Trends and developments in international education
- Education beyond borders
- Building global partnerships
- Presentations on international projects and awarding of Certificates of Achievement.

How to participate

Participation in DFI will be based on a competitive selection process. Places are limited and successful participants will be expected to commit to the requirements of the program. Applicants must seek approval from their supervisor before applying.

Faculty leadership team are invited to nominate both academic and professional staff who are then required to complete the online Expression of Interest (EOI) form. Three places are allocated to each Faculty.

Professional staff from Deakin's administrative portfolios/divisions can complete the online EOI form directly.

EOI closes Friday 31 January 2020.

All selected participants will receive official confirmation by Monday 10 February 2020.
