Entry requirements

Admission to study postgraduate coursework at Deakin is based on recognition of your professional experience and previous qualifications. Entry into the Graduate Certificate of Higher Education (Learning and Teaching) is based on your performance in:

- a bachelor degree in any discipline <u>or</u>
- at least two years of relevant work experience

Applicants must also meet the minimum English language requirements.
