


#### Course overview

Deakin's Master of Applied Learning and Teaching (Secondary) qualifies you to work as an educator in secondary schools and other youth settings. It equips you with the knowledge, skills and experience to teach in an applied learning pedagogy in two subject specialisations based on your undergraduate degree, and in vocational education including the Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL) or an interstate equivalent.

The course uses a problem-based approach that is closely aligned with authentic school improvement initiatives, and links theory and practice through strong work-integrated learning partnerships. It focuses on the middle and upper years of secondary schooling and has a strong emphasis on experiential and applied learning pedagogies which enhance student engagement.

# Professional experience

Develop your skills and grow your teaching confidence with supported practical experience in schools. You will undertake at least 75 days of professional experience (including a 15-day alternative placement) and receive support to help you develop as a teacher.

### Career opportunities

Graduates are equipped with the advanced professional knowledge, skills and attributes required to teach in secondary schools and other youth-learning contexts where applied and vocational learning approaches are being implemented. This program also offers a pathway to PhD through research training and a dissertation.

# Entry requirements9


- a bachelor degree in a different discipline including successful completion of major studies in at least one curriculum area recognised by the regulatory authority (Victorian Institute of Teaching), OR
- a Graduate Certificate of Adult Vocational Educational and Training (GCAVET), AND
- an approved certificate of proficiency/completion of trade with relevant industrial experience not less than eight years (including an apprenticeship).

Applicants must also meet the minimum English language requirements and successfully complete the CASPer test.

#### Casper test

Applicants must complete an additional selection tool for non-academic attributes. Casper is an online, video-based situational judgment test designed to measure personal and professional characteristics.
